

Construction works to commence

Construction works are commencing on the Carmody's Hill Wind Farm as the project moves into the next phase of delivery from the week commencing 20th April.

We are committed to keeping the community informed about construction activities and any potential impacts in and around the project area. As the construction of the wind farm progresses, we will continue to develop notifications to ensure that you are informed.

What works are happening now?

Early construction activities will start from the week commencing 20th April and will focus on site establishment and mobilisation, including establishment of site compounds and early civil works to support later construction stages.

Following this, preparation of internal access tracks will occur.

Road works and local access

Over the coming months, some local road works and upgrades may be required to safely support construction traffic and ongoing site access.

Where road works are planned, affected residents and road users will be notified in advance with information on:

- the location and nature of works
- expected timing and duration
- any temporary access or traffic changes

All road works will be undertaken in coordination with the Northern Areas Council and relevant road standards.

Traffic and heavy vehicle movements

As construction activities ramp up, there will be an increase in construction traffic, including heavy vehicles, in the local area. You will start to see an increase in traffic from the 20th April onwards, with up to twenty light vehicles in the area mobilising and several trucks delivering earthmoving equipment to the construction compound site on Lehmann Road in the first week.

There will be a steady increase in traffic on Patterson, Humphris and Lehmann Roads into May, with the arrival of approximately twenty demountable offices and buildings being delivered on trucks. These vehicles will all be travelling through Georgetown via Georgetown-Caltowie Road onto Lehmann Road to the construction compound site.

Vehicle movements will be planned to prioritise community safety, with agreed haul routes and traffic management measures in place where required. Traffic arrangements have been developed in consultation with the Northern Areas Council and Department of Infrastructure and Transport, aligned with relevant road standards.

We recognise increased traffic can be disruptive and thank the community for their patience.

Managing dust during construction

Dust management is an important focus during construction. A range of dust mitigation measures will be implemented, including:

- use of water carts on unsealed roads and work areas consistent with project traffic movements
- speed limits for construction vehicles on internal tracks to 40km/hr on site and driving to conditions on external roads
- monitoring and adjustment of works during dry or windy conditions

These measures will be applied throughout construction to help minimise impacts to nearby landholders and residents.



Local businesses and service providers

Carmody's Hill Wind Farm is committed to supporting local businesses and service providers wherever possible during construction. Local suppliers interested in being involved are encouraged to register their details so they can be considered for relevant opportunities as works progress.

Workforce and accommodation

Carmody's Hill Wind Farm's principal contractor, DT Infrastructure, is working closely with the Northern Areas Council to establish purpose built workforce accommodation to house a portion of the workers expected in the region.

The project may still require alternative accommodation with preference given to available local housing.

Further details will be shared with the community as arrangements are finalised.

Community Benefit Fund

The Carmody's Hill Wind Farm community benefit fund has been established to support host communities impacted by the project.

The fund is designed to deliver projects and initiatives that deliver long term benefits to the local area, supporting the community both through the construction and operational phases of the project.

The Fund is a registered association managed by a community led committee consisting of representatives from the local nearby townships most impacted. This included the Georgetown, Gulgare, Caltowie/ Bundaleer/ Washpool, Gladstone and Nukunu communities.
